

PRE-ANESTHESIA LUMPECTOMY FORM

Prior to placing your pet under anesthesia there are several options to consider regarding their comfort and safety. Risks are involved with every anesthetic procedure for all pets, but **the items listed below can help to reduce this**. Be aware that the items you select are in **addition** to the price of the procedure. Please read the following and ask any questions.

Procedure Requirements

Examination (\$55.00) - This is required for all new patients and for all pets that have not had a physical examination at My Family Vet within the last year. A full physical exam will be completed by the vet prior to the anesthetic procedure. This is to ensure your pet is healthy enough today to handle the anesthesia and the necessary procedure. This will assist the doctor in getting to know your pet and your pet's needs prior to the procedure.

- o YES, I would like to have an exam performed today.
- o NO, my pet has received an exam at your facility within the last year

Blood Work – It is required to have a pre-surgical blood profile performed on your pet before any procedure. We always use the safest form of anesthesia for your pet, but this profile can provide information about any pre-existing conditions your pet may have. Kidney and liver values, white blood count, red blood count, platelet counts and many other values are obtained and can determine if your pet is ready for the procedure.

- o **Pre-Anesthetic Blood Profile (\$95.00)** This provides basic kidney, liver, glucose, protein and electrolyte values as well as an anemia screen. This is recommended for younger, generally healthy pets and pets that have never been under anesthesia.
- o **Comprehensive Diagnostic Profile (\$155.00)** This provides a 12 value blood panel, complete blood count and electrolytes. This panel adds more information on the pancreas, gallbladder and cholesterol. This is highly recommended for ALL PETS OVER 8 YEARS OLD.
- o NO, my pet has received bloodwork within the last year

Rabies Vaccine (\$25.00). If your pet is not current on the Rabies vaccine we will administer one in clinic the day of the surgery. With your pets safety in mind, we recommend all core vaccines to be current also. In order to protect our team and your pet, we **require** proof of Rabies vaccine the day of the surgery

- o YES, please administer the Rabies vaccine to my pet he/she is not current
- o NO, my pet is current on the Rabies vaccine and I have provided documentation

Intravenous Fluids (\$98.00) Lumpectomies require IV fluids. This includes an IV catheter, extension set, and bag of fluids. It provides an ability to replace blood volume loss, flush the body of injectable anesthesia medications, maintain blood pressure, keep hydrated and provide a direct line to the heart if needed during the procedure.

Take Home Pain Management (\$30.00-50.00) Your pet will receive an injectable form of pain medication during the procedure to ensure that they are comfortable upon the completion of the procedure. This will generally keep your pet comfortable for up to 12 hours post-surgery. Oral pain medications can be used once you get your pet home and are required for all surgeries.

Procedure Options

ECG (Electrocardiogram) Screening (\$50.00) Our ECG screen is performed with a monitor via telemedicine and read by a certified cardiologist. This information will enable us to detect if your pet has any abnormalities in the heart, such as a heart murmur. If detected, we can alter our anesthesia protocols and inform you of any necessary care for the future. This ECG is highly recommended for **PERSIANS, BOXERS, ROTTWEILERS, DOBERMAN, KING CHARLES SPANIELS AND ENGLISH BULLDOGS.**

- o YES, I would like to have an ECG screen performed today.
- o NO, Please do not perform an ECG today.

Home Again Microchip Implant (\$48.00) A small chip is implanted in your pet underneath the skin, between the shoulder blades. All shelters and vet clinics scan found and lost pets and contact the owner if chip is found. This is an excellent method of getting your pet back if they are lost.

- o YES, I'd like a microchip for my pet today.
- o NO, Please do not microchip my pet.

E-Collar (\$13.00-\$27.00) This is a protective barrier made of a plastic, used to prevent your pet from damaging their incision.

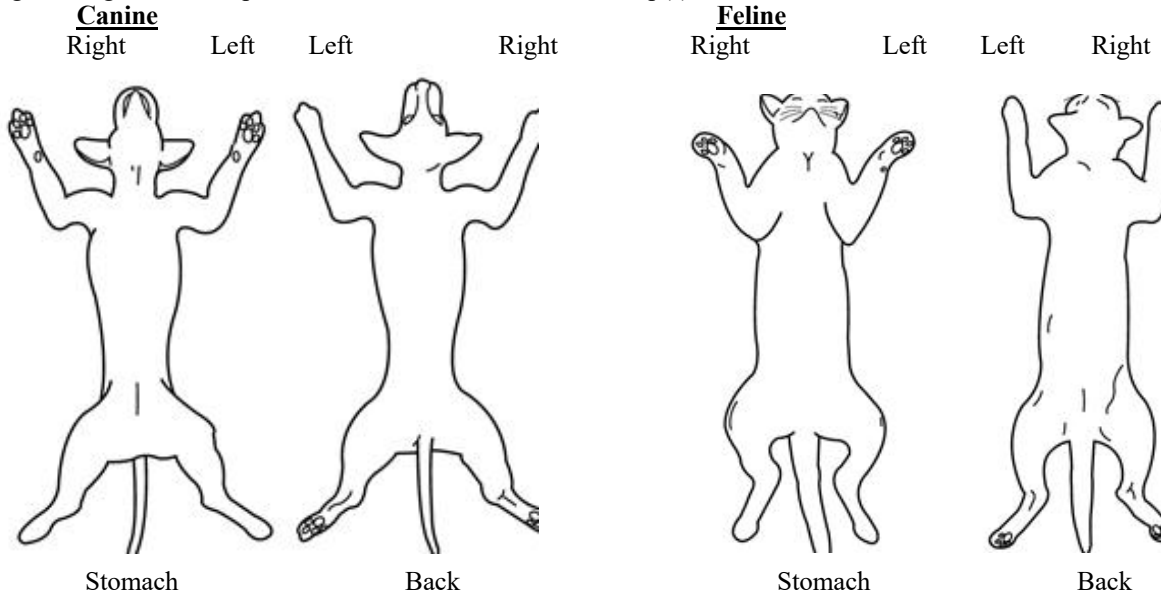

We here at My Family Vet thank you for giving us the opportunity to care for your pet, and want you to know that we do not take this responsibility lightly. The staff at My Family Vet will make every effort to prevent complications arising from your pet's illness/injury or from procedures carried out in our hospital. However, in some cases, there is risk that your pet may experience respiratory and/or cardiac arrest while hospitalized. We are fully prepared should an emergency event occur and want to be aware of your wishes when caring for your loved one in order to meet both your emotional and financial needs.

We are requesting that you choose whether or not you want us to revive your pet in the unlikely event that your pet experiences respiratory and/or cardiac arrest.

If a pet arrests, there is a short and critical window of opportunity to initiate CPR beyond which the success rate of cardio-pulmonary resuscitation decreases significantly. By selecting now, we will be able to initiate our efforts without delay. Once we have initiated CPR, we will contact you to make further decisions.

CPR --- I wish the staff to perform resuscitation (CPR) on my pet if my pet suffers from cardiac arrest, respiratory arrest, or collapse

DNR -- I DO NOT wish the staff to perform CPR on my pet. I understand that if my pet suffers from cardiac arrest, respiratory arrest, collapse or unconsciousness if CPR is not performed, my pet will pass away.
